GENERAL ENGLISH


When you arrive in Ireland and at ICOT College, you will take a placement test to start your class. All the classes start every Monday.

There is no time limit on how long you should stay in a level. When you start a new level, you should be ready to move up after approximately 12 weeks, depending on your development. All the teachers make a weekly progress test and observe you during the classes to help you develop your skills.

The General English course, providing practical exercises in the classroom, will assist you with the following:

- ✓ Develop your reading, writing, listening and speaking using a method that is student centred
- ✓ Improve your communication skills to communicate effectively both in and outside the classroom
- ✓ Expand your knowledge and understanding of English grammar and use it correctly daily
- ✓ Grow your vocabulary with practical applications.

CORK - CORCAIGH

Cork is a city in southwest Ireland, in the province of Munster, and is the second largest city in Ireland.
You certainly will find great historical spots all around Cork. Close to ICOT Cork's campus, you can walk though Barrack's Street which is known for the Viking's landing before they went to a marshy island.

You can do almost everything by walking or cycling, without needing public transport or spending stressful hours in traffic. Also, with the lower cost of living than in Dublin, you can save on accommodation, food market and leisure.







The job market is very attractive as you will find a large industrial hub with several multinationals such as Amazon, Johnson and Johnson, Apple, Pepsico, and Motorola, among others.

The city offers an excellent quality of life for its residents with many parks where you can spend a lovely day or work out, gyms, castles, churches, museums, shopping malls, theatres, pubs, and restaurants.

You will also find great universities that welcome many students of different nationalities. With a population young and cosmopolitan, Cork is well known for welcoming its various communities such as the LGBTQ+ community, Polish, Chinese and Unkranine communities.

ICOT College Cork is also located in the city's heart, opposite two mains street, Grand Parade and South Mall. Our structure has three buildings for our students with large classrooms, a lunch area and a library.

Our partnership with Academy Plus supports all non-EEA (non-European) students travelling to Ireland in case of any accident or illness. It also meets the needs of students attending educational institutions that do not have financial support from the Irish state. In Ireland, it is a legal obligation to hold this insurance.

Trinity qualifications help equip people with the transferable language skills they need for the 21st century. Trinity's Integrated Skills in English (ISE) exam is recognised across all higher education institutions in the Republic of Ireland as evidence of English language proficiency.

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ELT Ireland is a network for professionals involved in all aspects of English Language Teaching that promotes learning, development and best practice through sharing knowledge and experiences.

The purpose of ELT Ireland is to establish a network of teachers, supervisors, managers, and researchers committed to improving teaching in English as a Foreign or Second Language in Ireland.



The TIE exam is intended for all students following a long or short course in many different schools. It is for students above the age of 18.

The TIE is a student-focused exam which allows the students to express themselves regardless of language proficiency or cultural background by making their interests a part of its test.



The fact that a provider and courses listed on the ILEP mean that per Ireland's student immigration policy, attendance at that college in respect of one of their listed full-time courses on the ILEP is an eligible purpose for a non-European national coming to Ireland.

To receive the ILEP accreditation, the institution meets specific criteria, including the mandatory provision of learner protection for enrolled non-European students.



ICOT College is part of the Progressive College Network.

This formed organisation meets the demand for an alternate representative body for the private college community in Ireland to promote a high-quality education destination to the country.

You must attend class to develop and establish fluency in the English language. You must also keep your attendance above 85% to be able to renew your visa with the Immigration Office.

WEATHER

Ireland has a mild, temperate climate. Although it's rainy sometimes, you must prepare good sneakers to walk around and discover the city. In most places, you can go on foot or by bike; comfortable sneakers will help you discover this fantastic city.

You will also need a good and comfortable sweater to protect you from the cold and wind during the winter, and remember to pack your favourite outfits to wear during summer and important events.

During Winter, usually between November and February - the average temperatures vary between 8°C and 4°C, the weather is humid, and the days are cloudy. In summer, between May and July - the days are hot and very long, with some days having sunset after 10 pm!

This time of year is excellent for cultural and historical tours, such as castles, museums and pubs! This is also the peak season for tourists, festivals, and events.

ENTERTAINMENT

You can explore Dublin's hidden secrets by walking or public transport. The city has many attractions to offer, and you will be able to find exciting entertainment to go to. On every corner, you can find an interesting thing about the city: you can choose one of the numerous parks to spend the day in, visit a museum or go to one of the many pubs that offer a great beer selection for all kinds of taste buds.

Not to mention that in each of them, you will find diverse musical styles, people and, most important: stories!

You can find different spots for making good friends and applying all the skills you have learned during your classes! Beer is a very popular item in Ireland's culture, as many litres are consumed daily, so all the pubs are city attractions.

Each pub has its characteristics, and you can find the best one that suits your taste.

In the market, you can buy beer or any other type of alcohol if you are over 18, but you are not allowed to consume it on the street. Even though it is an essential item in the Irish culture, you can get fined if caught drinking on the street.

Alternatively, you can enjoy going to a pub or having a get-together at home with friends, the so-called after party.

Dublin is a lively city frequented by many young people, with job opportunities and is very well located within the European map, and has become a destination covered by students worldwide.

TRANSPORT

There are many choices for using public transport in Dublin. You will pay according to the number of stops you go to, and also you have an excellent alternative to make quick trips as the city offers train services, buses and an easy way to the airport so you can enjoy a short getaway trip.

The buses in Ireland have an exclusive lane on the roads, which helps to escape the peak times of the city. All the public transport is spacious and clean, and the large windows allow you to observe the landscape while travelling, making it a much more enjoyable trip.

If you choose to live away from the city centre or make a weekend trip to the coast of Ireland, you can count on the DART (Dublin Area Rapid Transit System), which serves the coastline and the city of Dublin. It is an electrified commuter rail railway network with affordable pricing.

To help you discover Dublin itself, you might you the Luas, which is a public transport tram system that operates only in Dublin.

If you enjoy riding a bicycle, you can use the Dublin bikes. It is a public bicycle rental scheme that has operated in Dublin since 2009. To use the Dublin Bikes, you must register for a card to use the service, and the first 30 minutes are free.


Electric bikes are another great choice if you enjoy riding. In Dublin, you will find electric bikes at affordable prices, such as Easy Motion and ListNride.




TRANSPORT
